Cataract Surgery

A cataract is a clouding of the natural lens of the human eye. The human lens normally works to help focus light onto the retina inside of the eye to make vision. The human lens grows and changes throughout life; usually, this is correctable with a change in glasses prescription. However, cataracts may be cloudy enough where surgery is needed to improve vision.

Glaucoma Surgery

Glaucoma is a term for a group of chronic medical eye conditions where there is continued, progressive damage to the optic nerve (the connection between the eye and the brain). Topical medications and various forms of laser eye surgery can help lower intraocular pressure, the only modifiable risk factor for slowing the progression of vision loss associated with glaucoma. Uncontrolled glaucoma ultimately leads to permanent vision loss.

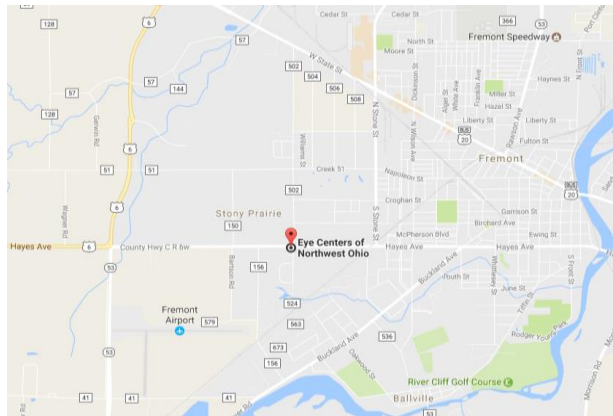

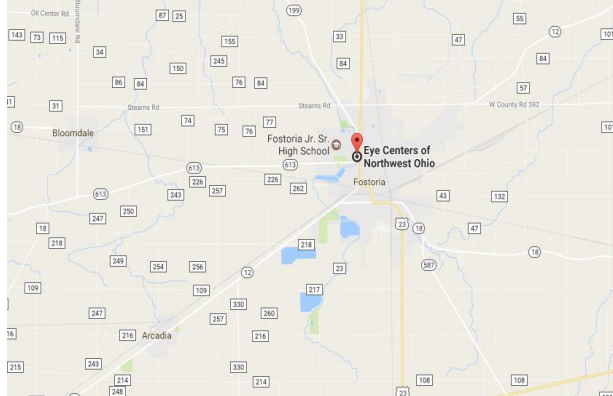

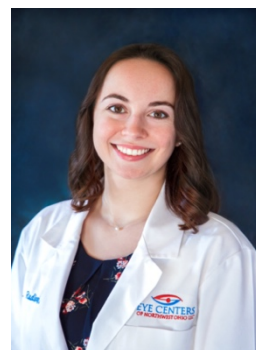
